Taxes and other financial support for junior colleges. "For the maintenance and operation of each junior college, in addition to the income from tuition paid by students as hereinbefore provided, the board of trustees may levy upon the taxable property within the district a tax not to exceed eighty cents (80¢) on each hundred dollars (\$100.00) of assessed valuation. The tax levy determined by the board of trustees, within said limit, shall be certified to the board of county commissioners in each county in which the district may

There shall also be allocated to each junior college district and paid to the treasurer thereof fifty per centum (50%) of all moneys apportioned to any county embracing all or a part of such junior college district, out of the liquor fund of the state of Idaho as set forth in chanter 4 title 22 Idaho
