TREASURER'S REPORT FOR AUGUST 1976, was approved upon MOTION by Mr. Babcock, seconded by Dr. Lehrman. Affirmative vote unanimous.

An employee of the College was defined as someone working at least 1/2 time (20 hours a week). Fees were defined as those regular fees charged by the College that are legally waivable by the Board. Fees waived are not to include any special fees identified with a specific class (i.e., special laboratory fees, material fees, fees for special education classes etc.)
