PRESIDENT'S REPORT: Dr. Taylor attended the President's Academy in
conjunction with the American Association of Community and Junior
Colleges. One of the conclusions of the group was that local

on campus November 4 and 5, 1976 in the new Vocational Technical
Center.



The City Council has agreed to defer the sidewalk requirement. This altered project will provide a 36 foot wide two-lane roadway with a temporary asphaltic surface from Washington Street to the easterly entrance of the Exposition Center parking lot and curb-gutter the full length of the College property.

The cost shown above will fulfill the total obligation of the College for the road except for cost of sidewalk to be placed when needed in the future.

As funds are developed from Greater Idaho, the City and other adjacent land owners, the road will be permanently constructed with a 44 foot wide section extending from Washington Street North to Blue Lakes Boulevard North.

for Buildings and Grounds and


WHEREAS, the entire amount will be needed during the current
