The Department of Health, Education and Welfare is hereinafter referred to (1)as the Department. Property acquired by a donee Shall be on an "as is", "where is" basis,

without warranty of any kind.

ADDITIONAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO PROPERTY HAVING A SINGLE (b) ITEM ACQUISITION COST OF \$2,500.00 OR MORE DONATED FOR HEALTH OR EDUCA-TIONAL PURPOSES, EXCEPT VESSELS 50 FEET OR MORE IN LENGTH AND AIRCRAFT.:

Such property shall be used only for the health or educational purpose for which acquired, including research for any such purpose, and for no other purpose.

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(2) Such property shall be placed in use for the purpose for which acquired no later than 12 months after acquisition thereof. In the event such property after the expiration of the 12 months of receipt the dones within 30 days after the expiration of the 12 months period, shall notify the Department in writing through the State Agency. Title and right to the possession of such property not so placed in use with the above mentioned period shall at the option of the Department revert to the United States of America, and

a period of A years of such aso.

(4) During the period of restriction the donee shall not sell, trade, lease, lend, bail, cannibalize or use for secondary utilization purposes, encumber, or otherwise dispose of such propety or remove it for use outside the State

wise disposed of during the nerind of restriction without prior written

disposal or for the fair market value or the property at the time of such disposal as determined by the Department. If during the period of restriction, property is no longer suitable, usable, or further needed by the dones for the purpose for which acquired, the dones shall promptly notify the Department through the State Agency, and

4. TERMS AND CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO THE DONATION OF AIRCRAFT HAVING AN ACQUISITION COST OF \$2,500.00 OR MORE, REGARDLESS OF THE PURPOSE FOR WHICH ACQUIRED.
