Bid opening on the new vo-tech building will be held in June. The building will be heated from hot water. Dr. Taylor asked for permission from the Board to advertise for drilling a second geothermal well to assist in the heating of the campus. He believes that the total funding from this well can come from the Economic Development Act Program, which has already funded a portion of the vo-tech building. A second geothermal well would reduce the cost of retrofiting the campus because of distances involved. The energy efforts on campus need to be housed in a specific location. Dr. Taylor asked permission ulbo from the Board to advertice for a pro-engineered building. that would probably be placed behind the Maintenance Building for this purpose. Mr. Hamilton moved that the request to advertise for both the drilling of the second geothermal well and the pre-engineered building be APPROVED by the Board. Affirmative vote unanamous.

Dr. Taylor announced to the Board that the museum opening would be in conjunction with the 75 Birthday celebration of the city of Twin Falls, which is to take place during the second week of June. He also indicated that publicity would be sent out as soon as final arrangements were made.
