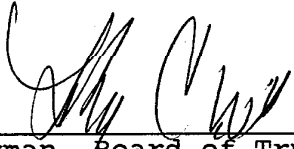

Resolution to Open Deposit Accounts for Federal
EDPMS Fund and Perkins/National Direct Student Loan Fund

WHEREAS, the Department of Education has passed legislation
maintaining that all Federal funds be kept in a separate

account, the College of Southern Idaho presently holds all
financial aid funds in a consolidated non-interest bearing
account that must be re-named.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the
College of Southern Idaho Junior College District that:

(a) A new bank account be established in the Twin
Falls Bank and Trust in Twin Falls, Idaho. The name
of the account shall be Perkins/National Direct
Student Loan Fund and shall contain all
