PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

1. Dr. Thad Scholes, whose current trustee term expires on December 31, 1996, signed the Oath of Office for a six year term on the Board of Trustees. Dr. Scholes was re-elected in the general election held on November 5, 1996.

2. Dale Riedesel presented a report concerning campus stormwater runoff retention options. He analyzed and offered several alternatives at varying costs to deal with future city, canal and Environmental Protection Agency

is 100 percent retainage of all stormwater. Mr. Riedesel advised the Board to ensure that plans for the new South Central Health District Building contained plans for storm water retention.

Mr. Riedesel also advised the Board that the City of Twin Falls and the Twin Falls Canal Company were conducting a study of requirements for storm water retention. This study is expected to be complete in September of 1997. He advised the College to wait for the completion of this study and the ensuing regulations before undertaking a major project to retain storm water runoff from older buildings and parking lots.

3. Dr. Chuck Brockway presented his study on the campus

The College currently has approximately one hundred and fifteen acres to irrigate and over two hundred water shares available to utilize for irrigation. Dr. Brockway presented three alternatives along with prices for developing a campus irrigation system utilizing canal water shares. These alternatives involved pumping stations and ponds. The drilling of a well was considered but is clouded by the moratorium on drilling commercial wells and water right issues.

The Board will determine which alternative, if any, to proceed with at a later date.

4. Associated Student Body President Shane Ridley-Stevens and Josic Pedrianez raised student concerns about the

buildings and the dorm, the students recommended that the faculty and staff who are here all day park in the Expo parking lot. A shuttle bus could run from the Expo around the campus loop.
