#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

- 1. Mike Mason and John Martin reported on a voice mail system and a form scanning system. The Board approved the administration bringing back proposals at the March board meeting for both systems on MOTION by Dr. Thad Scholes. Affirmative vote was unanimous...
- 2. Debi Klimes reviewed the activities of the Center for New Directions over the last year. She noted that:

- 3. Dr. Jerry Beck advised the Board that the new admissions policy formalized a lot of what we are already doing. It

- 4. The President reviewed the status of our appropriation/property tax bill and the optional retirement
- 5. The President advised the Board that the Joint Finance workload adjustment be put back into our appropriation. Even with this addition, we will be getting approximately \$20,000 less than our beginning appropriation for fiscal year 1997.

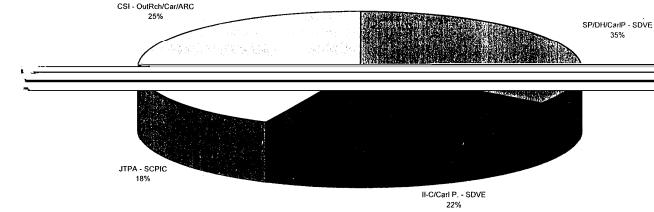
