PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

1. Priscilla Bingham explained the planned Renaissance Fair that is to be held on campus on April 24th and 25th of this year. She is making the event a full campus event with participation by various student clubs and organizations.

Ms. Bingham introduced three of her students. Students Brittney Jones, Russell King and Scott Glennon were in costume and are involved in the organizing of the fair.

2. Dr. Al Frost and Jan Mittleider gave a presentation on the Over 60 and Getting Fit program. This semester, 165 people are enrolled in the program. They reviewed the tremendous impact the program had on lives and the improved health of the participants. Data indicated that the participants led longer, healthier lives.

The Board and President Meyerhoerrer expressed the la appreciation to Dr. Frost and Jan Mittleider for their work in the program.

- 3. Dale Riedesel made a presentation to the Board concerning a five-year paving plan for the campus. The plan is estimated to cost approximately \$200,000 per year.
- 4. The Board approved a 7% increase in tuition and fees for fiscal year 1999 on MOTION by Bill Babcock. Affirmative vote was unanimous. The \$40 increase is made up of a \$25 increase in tution, a \$10 increase in the athletic fee and a new fee of \$5 for an outdoor club.
- 5. The President briefed the Board on the status of several bills in the legislature. He said the Governor's recommendation of a general fund appropriation increase of approximately 10% appeared to be headed for passage.
- 6. The Student Senate is donating \$3,000 to help fund the Renaissance Fair. The Board approved \$3,000 from the administrative budget to match the Senate donation on MOTION by Dr. Thad Scholes. Affirmative vote was unanimous.
- 7. The Board discussed the purchase of the Northview Apartments for use as married student housing. The Board approved using \$30,000 from the Plant Facility Fund for earnest money to be attached to an offer with conditions for the purchase of the North View apartments on MOTION by Bill
