PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

1. Associated College of Southern Idaho Student Body President A.J. Buhler and Vice President Victoria Field <u>snoke to the Board concerning Education Week.</u> They outlined

objectives for the 1999-2000 school year and answered questions from the Board. The President and Chairman Jehrman commended the students for their work.

2. President Meyerhoeffer reviewed the history of the use of CSI vans by both the community and the college. Shawn Barigar spoke on behalf of the Boys and Girls Club and requested occasional use of the vans. Dr. Scholes recommended we consider eliminating van use for organizations that are not directly affiliated with CSI.

College Attorney Robert Alexander indicated that he would work on a van use policy. This policy will define

The most common PC year 2000 hardware problem is a failure to transition from 31-Dec-1999 to 1-Jan-

All DCs win a Basic-Input/Output System (RIOS) program hard-wired into the computer before any

parameters. It also sets up the system date and time by reading values from the real time clock chip, which is battery-powered (rechargeable) to keep a constant time reference for the PC.

Most PC BIOS programs have four digits allocated for recording the year (1997), but most only change the last two digits (97).

The majority of PCs tested have failed the basic rollover test.

Many programs read their internal dates from the operating system date which reads from the BIOS, or
