schools and a central site. The two bids had some variation in products and services offered. A committee evaluated the bids and took steps to equalize them based upon criteria in the request for proposal.

The adjusted total bid prices are as follows:

evaluation committee recommended the elimination of the team station and the educational component. It was also recommeded that the maintenance agreement be purchased one year at a time.

The manufacturer also reduced equipment prices on one item after the bid. With these reductions, an initial

equipment purchases, installation and maintenance agreements. A second purchase order for an equipment colocation fee of \$12,000 per year and a management and maintenance fee of \$2,400 per year will be cut at a later date.

Based upon a review of the bids by the ARTEC Board of Directors, I recommend that we accept the proposal of Micron Internet Services of Boise, Idaho in the amount of \$313,133.72 for the specified project.

In discussions with Dave Sass and Mike Mason, I was advised that the College of Southern Idaho Board of Trustees will be considering a recommendation at their June 13, 2000 meeting from the ARTEC Board of Directors to award the ARTEC net Request for Proposal to Micron Internet Services. The purpose of my letter is to appeal the intended award of the ARTECnet Request for Proposal to Micron

- 1. Micron's price did not include five Intel Team Stations as required in the RFP. Micron only included the price for four on the Bid Price Form they submitted. This resulted in an inaccurate comparison. Micron's price for a Team Station is \$10,211. Including the fifth team station in the evaluation would have resulted in a difference in U S WEST's favor for the one-year cost of \$2,629.96 and \$13,137.06 for the three-year cost comparison.
- 2. The educational assistance portion of this RFP was not considered in the award decision and had it been used, as stated in the RFP document, the award outcome would have been in U S WEST's favor.

Following is a more detail explanation of the two issues:

1. Micron's Price did not include five Intel Team Stations as required

Micron's proposal did not include five Intel Team Stations as required in the Bid Price Form of the RFP, because as Micron's response states: "Price is for 4 Intel Team Stations rather than five since Micron

On the surface it sounds like an additional Team Station isn't required. However, why is there a Team Station at Micron's site? Since this equipment is at Micron's site today, it is safe to assume ARTEC will contend with other users for this equipment. The RFP does not provide for this type sharing. Secondly, if

As the chart above shows, U S WEST's point total is 67 points or 8.12% greater than Micron's and Micron's price is \$7,581.80 or 1.68% less than U S WEST's.

The RFP states about the Education Assistance: "while not bid "requirements" per se, special consideration will be given to vendors who address the issues below and demonstrate a willingness to become a partner in education with ARTEC by providing industry experts and "real world' demonstrations of applications."

It is obvious from points awarded by the evaluators (295 for U S WEST and 218 for Micron) that


