The attached spreadsheets outline some options concerning the costs of operating busses, leasing or contracting for bus services. It appears that contracting for long trips and leasing a bus from Trans IV by the hour

Leasing 22 passenger busses will still be more expensive that operating the 15 passenger vans with our existing staff. The busses are safer and the bus drivers are subject to more training and regulations than our van drivers.
