3. The President and Dr. Jerry Beck explained the purpose of the five year National Institute for Staff and Occupational Development (NISOD) student survey. The data gained from the first year of the survey was reviewed. The President noted that the survey showed that ninety six percent of our students were very likely to recommend the College of Southern Idaho to a friend or family member and that cost was one of the major barriers for students. He also said the survey showed that academic courses were more

weak areas as well as maintain strong ones.
