


NEW BUSINESS:

process, CSI shall provide information to the City and Agency relative to the size of parcel needed to accomplish its designs. Agency shall immediately pursue an amendment to the Disposition and Development Agreement with Lincoln Commons to achieve the objectives of this MOU.

- 3. Following execution of this MOU, CSI agrees to retain professional services for the purpose of designing the facility of higher education intended to be constructed and maintained on the CSI Site to be conveyed by the Agency. - 4. Upon completion of the land division, and completion of the facility design, the Agency shall convey the CSI Site upon satisfaction of the following additional conditions:




