The dental hygienist is a highly valued and integral part of the oral health care team. The licensed dental hygienist is able to practice in a variety of settings from the private and group dental offices to health departments, hospitals, health maintenance organizations, long-term care facilities, the armed services and government agencies.

Dental Hygiene Program Goals:

Demonstrate a comprehensive understanding of Dental Hygiene practice.

Demonstrate clinical proficiency by developing patient treatment plans to provide comprehensive oral hygiene care.

Learn and develop leadership and organizational skills to facilitate community-based service.

Foster team building, communication and Integrity necessary to contribute to clinical employment settings.

Prepare for successful completion of the National Dental Hygiene Exam and the Western Regional Clinic Board Exam (WREB).

Admittance Requirements:

CSI application, placement information, meet with program advisor.
